Occupational Therapy Scholarships

Below are outside scholarship opportunities specific to occupational therapy degree seeking students. Additional resources can be found on Scholarships.

AMBUCS Scholarship Program

Open to physical therapy, occupational therapy, speech language pathology and hearing audiology with awards from \$600 to \$6,000. Applications typically open February to May 1st.

AOTA E.K. Wise Scholarship

The fund for the E. K. Wise scholarship was established in the 1960s through the generous bequest of Elizabeth K. Wise and supports students pursuing an entry-level occupational therapy (OT) or occupational therapy assistant (OTA) degree from diverse backgrounds. Yearly, three awards will be granted in the amount of \$2,500. Students may apply for a second year. Applications typically open in February.

AOTF Scholarship Program

Many scholarships are available from the American Occupational Therapy Foundation and state occupational therapy associations. Applicants complete only one online form to apply. for all qualifying scholarships listed below with application opening August 28th:

Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR)

Applicants must be citizens of the United States to apply for a scholarship offered by the DAR Scholarship Committee. Applicants must also attend or plan to attend an accredited college or university in the United States.

Health Career Scholarships

IOKDS provides annual Health Career Scholarship application to pharmacy, occupational therapy, physical therapy, speech therapy and medical technology students who have completed a minimum of two years of study. Applications typically open November 1st to March 1st.

HIE Help Center Scholarship

Open to students seeking to pursue physical, occupational or therapy with a minimum GPA of 3.0. Applications typically open in January.

Occupational/Physical Therapy Scholarship

The Occupational/Physical Therapy Scholarship, in the amount of \$2,000, is awarded to two students who are in financial need and have been accepted or are attending an accredited school of occupational therapy (including art, music, or physical therapy).

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
