Why do we collect this information?

By identifying and mitigating relevant financial relationships, we work together to create a protected space to learn, teach, and engage in scientific discourse free from influence from organizations that may have an incentive to insert commercial bias into education.

What are the next steps in this process?

Please note: the identification of relevant financial relationships does not necessarily mean that you are unable to participate in the planning and implementation of this educational activity. Rather, the accreditation standards require that relevant financial relationships are mitigated before you assume your role in this activity. To help us meet these expectations, please use the form we have provided to share all financial relationships you have had with ineligible companies during the past 24 months. This information is necessary in order for us to be able to move to the next steps in planning this continuing education activity.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Ineligible companies. The ACCME defines an ineligible company as a company whose primary business is producing, marketing, selling, re-selling, or distributing healthcare products used by or on patients.

Financial relationships. Financial relationships are those relationships in which the individual benefits by receiving a salary, royalty, intellectual property rights, consulting fee, honoraria, ownership interest (e.g., stocks, stock options or other ownership interest, excluding diversified mutual funds), or other financial benefit. Financial benefits are usually associated with roles such as employment, management position, independent contractor (including contracted research), consulting, speaking and teaching, membership on advisory committees or review panels, board membership, and other activities from which remuneration is received, or expected.

Accreditation focuses on financial relationships with ineligible companies in the 24-month period preceding the time that the individual is being asked to assume a role controlling content of the CME activity. There is not a set minimal dollar amount for relationships to be significant. Inherent in any amount is the incentive to maintain or increase the value of the relationship. "Financial relationships" can be in any amount occurring within the past 24 months.

Disclosure. Planners and Staff must complete and submit this Disclosure Statement prior to any participation in planning meetings or discussions for the activity. Speakers and Authors must complete and submit this Disclosure Statement prior to the presentation, and ensure that the Disclosure Statement is complete and truthful to the best of their knowledge. Faculty members are required to disclose all financial relationships they may have with a manufacturer of any product or class of products they discuss in an educational activity.

Fair Balance. Speakers/authors are required to prepare fair and balanced presentations that are objective and scientifically rigorous.

Unlabeled and Unapproved Uses. Presentations that provide information in whole or in part related to **non-FDA approved** uses for drug products and/or devices must clearly acknowledge the unlabeled indications or the investigational nature of their proposed uses to the audience. Speakers/authors who plan to discuss non-FDA approved uses for commercial products and/or devices must advise the Program of their intent.

Use of Generic versus Trade Names. Presenters should use scientific or generic names when referring to products in their lectures or enduring materials. Should it be necessary to use a trade name, then the trade names of all similar products or those within a class should be used.

Faculty members are not permitted to receive any direct remuneration or gifts from the commercial supporter(s) of this activity as it relates to this specific activity, nor should they be subject to direct input from a commercial supporter regarding the content of their presentations.
