Master of Public Health Scholarships

Below are outside scholarship opportunities specific to graduate/professional degree seeking students. Additional resources can be found on <u>Scholarships</u> and on <u>Public Health Online</u>.

Albert Schweitzer Fellowship

This fellowship partners graduate students with community-based health organizations for a yearlong service project designed to identify and address an unmet health need.

Association of Schools of Public Health

The ASPH offers a variety of graduate fellowships and internships at host agencies, such as the EPA, CDC and NHTSA. Fellows receive a stipend of \$43,000 to \$52,000 per year (varies by education and agency). All fellowships last at least a year but some last two years if the host agency has the funding and dependent upon the performance of the fellow during the first year.

CDC Fellowships

The Centers for Disease Control offers a variety of hands-on training programs for undergraduate or graduate students still in school, and for health professionals who are in training. All offer a unique experience in one of the many exciting public health fields.

Dr. Mary K. Beyrer Graduate Scholarship

The Foundation for the Advancement of Heath Education (FAHE) Board of Directors continue to maintain a scholarship in the name of Dr. Mary K. Beyer. This \$1,000 scholarship is presented annually. Applicants must have a minimum 3.5 gpa, major in health education: community, school, or public education and demonstrate professional activity through attendance at professional meetings, service or organizational memberships related to health education.

Dr. Delbert Oberteuffer Scholarship

The Foundation for the Advancement of Heath Education (FAHE) offers this \$1,500 scholarship to recognize doctoral students for their academic achievement, potential for advancing the health of children and youth, and professional goals in health education and promotion.

HOSA Scholarships

HOSA-Future Health Professionals offers a variety of scholarships for students pursuing degrees in public health. Scholarship awards are available for both undergraduate and graduate studies. Students interested in being considered for these scholarships must be members of HOSA.

National Academies Fellowships

The National Academies' Fellowship Office of Policy and Global Affairs administers predoctoral, dissertation, postdoctoral, and other fellowship programs for advanced study in a variety of research-based disciplines, including public health.

Nurses Educational Funds. Inc. Scholarships

The NEF offers a variety of graduate scholarships for nursing and public health majors. Award amounts vary and many are based on academic achievement.

Pedro Zamora Public Policy Fellowship

AIDS United offers the Pedro Zamora Public Policy Fellowship for both undergraduate and graduate students seeking experience in public policy and government affairs focused on HIV/AIDS issues. The fellowship includes a stipend and is highly competitive. Applications are accepted for the fall, spring, and summer terms.

Society for Public Health Education (SOPHE)

SOPHE offers a robust awards, fellowship, internship and scholarship program for health education and health promotion practitioners, students and faculty in more than 15 categories. There are two cycles for applications, nominations and submissions – summer/fall (July through October) and winter/spring (February through June).

• 21st Century Student Scholarship

Full-time undergraduate and graduate-level students can apply for up to \$1,500 in financial support for costs associated with travel, accommodations, event registration, meals and incidentals to attend SOPHE's Annual Conference or SOPHE's Advocacy Summit. Application typically closes February $16^{\rm th}$.

• Vivian Drenckhahn Student Scholarship

This \$2,500 scholarship is awarded annually to three deserving full-time undergraduate or graduate students who are national SOPHE members and who have excelled academically, demonstrated a commitment to addressing the public's health through a career in health education, and who have demonstrated financial need.

Students applying for this award must currently be pursuing a health education degree (e.g., health education, community health education, public health education, school health education), and must have completed at least one-third of the coursework required for their major.

Leaders in Equity & Diversity Fellowship

Diverse students who are national SOPHE members in a variety of health-related fields and

Truman Scholarships

Available to undergraduate students in their junior year of study, these scholarships of up to \$30,000 fund graduate study in a variety of public service fields, including public health.

The Oberteuffer Scholarship

This \$1,500 scholarship is available to doctoral students that show potential in advancing children's health. The scholarship is also based on academic achievement, professional goals, document caliber.

USAID Global Health Fellows Program

The Global Health Fellows Program is a cooperative agreement with the US Agency for International Development (USAID) implemented and managed by the Public Health Institute (PHI) in partnership with Global Health Corps, GlobeMed, Management Systems International and PYXERA Global. GHFP-II fellows work full-time for two years in a variety of global health technical areas ranging from maternal and child health to nutrition to HIV/AIDS. Placements are made both in Washington, DC and in developing countries.
